THE ORPHANAGE AT KHE SANH CONTINUES TO GROW

The bus drive from Hue to Khe Sanh was emotionally and spiritually charged. Several team members had been working on our tour guide (witnessing). To save time, chapel had been conducted on the bus that morning. An added benefit to this was that we were able to use it as a means to expose the tour guide, the bus driver, and the bus driver's assistant to the Word of God. There had been several impromptu sing-a-longs which were quite moving, but nothing tugs at the heart like the unbridled bliss of a child. The children were at school when we first arrived at the orphanage, but came home shortly afterward. They received gifts of clothing, toys, candy and Vietnamese Bibles.



After a little hymn singing, photo ops, and lunch, the children were asked what they would like painted on their bedroom walls. All were expecting requests of typical childhood themes---animals, storybook characters, etc., but

we were delighted that they asked for spiritually based paintings.



They requested pictures of Jesus, the Bible, and sheep. My assignment was helping with the sheep. I was filled to overflowing when I heard a small voice singing softly somewhere behind me. I looked over my shoulder and the one little boy who was too young to attend school, broke into giggles and began to clap with excitement.



I didn't understand any of the words he was singing, but there was no mistaking the sentiment. He was elated! What impressed us all more than anything was the way the tour guide, bus driver, and assistant voluntarily pitched in to help. They were as eager to be involved as we were. They mixed paint, washed brushes, carted supplies back and forth, etc. And it was evident that they were doing it because it brought them joy.

Just average men, paid to do a simple job, no strings attached---except those firmly affixed to the heart by the grinning eyes of a child. What a blessing! It was definitely one of the highlights of the trip. - Karen Perkins
